At least once each year, one of my duties to the ACA membership is to provide my perspective on the status of the organization. The key areas are: the financial status, major endeavors undertaken, membership status, and present a budget for the next year's operation.

We are doing a great job of supporting the Ammo School House, AFCOMAC, and many other local events in the Ammo community. These are the top reasons/priorities for us.

The financial status of the organization is on solid ground. Our checking and savings accounts are not growing, but they maintain a positive balance. For our budget, we depend mainly on the continued growth of our membership through annual or life membership dues. Over the past few years, we have noticed a downward trend in the number of active duty Ammo chiefs joining or maintaining their membership.

When I look back at the major endeavors of our organization over the past year, a lot of great things have taken place. I would like to thank all of the chapters for their strong support of the Ammo community. Without the strong support of local chapters and members, the ACA organization wouldn't be able to support our Ammo community.

Our membership stands at 193 members. This includes Regular, Associate, Honorary, and Shell and Flame Awards. The majority (121) of our memberships are not members of a chapter. There are areas that contain a large number of retired Ammo chiefs as well as retired Ammo troops that could be associate members that could establish a chapter. We will provide any assistance required to generate the charter and bylaws. Our budget for the coming year will be discussed at the business meeting during the reunion. Since the last annual state of the association, we had a change in the treasurer position. An audit was accomplished as part of the transition and nothing was found to be out of order. Our Treasurer will also provide an annual report during the business meeting at the reunion. This will also give us a chance to get feedback from the membership on the proposed 2015 budget.

After our reunion is over, the next major event will be the nomination of new officers in 2015, to take office on 1 January 2016. I hope we can get ahead of the game on this one so we don't have to draft anyone. I've enjoyed working with the ACA BOD over the years and think we are leaving the organization in good status for the next ACA BOD.

I look forward to seeing our members during the reunion where we will be able to discuss any issue one on one or as a group at the business meeting.

Moody Blues Ammo Call

Operation **Moody Blues Ammo Call** began on October 3rd, 2014 as the first of the deploying members began arriving at Camp Jones Pecan Farm near Ray City, Georgia (five miles north of Moody AFB), and the Ammo Flag was hoisted. The operating pecan farm is 54 acres located about a mile outside of the village that supported us with plenty of ice and beer! Our mission was clear. Bring the Ammo Flame to the area of retirees and active duty.

By 1800 Hours on the 3rd, the bed down of tents, canopies, camper and one big muddy RV had been accomplished. Ammo troops and dependents from Virginia, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida and Tennessee arrived and set up bare base operations in just a matter of hours. Showers had already been run into a converted stock trailer and porta-johns were in place. Retired Chief Zima and Retired Chief Fick arrived just before dark from their headquarters at a local motel. With ADVON bedded down, the Ammo Chiefs officially announced the beginning of **Moody Blues Ammo Call**.

Chili dogs, hamburgers and chips were served the first night as the music and campfires began. What a blessing it quickly became when Retired Ammo Brother Joe Santua began to play the guitar and sing. Chief Zima couldn't stand it any longer. Tom and Joe started singing as a duet and taking turns with Ammo Songs, Blues Songs and some original songs written by Joe himself. The night turned magical, and Ammo cheers started echoing the clear South Georgia night once again!

Saturday the 4th of October, started early with sausage and egg biscuits, and plenty of coffee. Ms Terrie Jones sent tray after tray around to everyone as the cooking began! Retired Ammo Brother John Davis started frying fresh caught fish from Florida while Retired Ammo Bob Jones started dropping hush puppies and fries. Retired Ammo Brother Joe Santua carefully started cooking over a 100 lbs of Boston Butts and goat. The smells of Ammo filled the countryside! Side dish after side dish of spring rolls, potato salads, cole slaws, beans, and pasta began appearing till the serving area was full. Ammo coins for the event was being passed out to arriving Ammo troops. Forty two retired Ammo troops had come by noon from the local area, Warner Robbins, the Florida Panhandle, and from all around the South. With the arrival of Ammo Ambassador Jimmy Taylor flying into Valdosta from Virginia at lunch time, the eating began! Ammo cheers, stories from the past, and hugs from members who hadn't seen each other in years filled the landscape. Only six active duty from the 23rd FW line-d arrived, and active duty Ammo Brother Jim Taylor arrived from Hurlbut. There was singing, laughing, joking and even a few lies told till dark.


The air turned cool fast after dark, and the bonfire grew bigger as everyone found a seat to keep warm. The beverage coolers were transported quickly from the dining area to the bonfire. We heard stories from Morbach, Lakenheath, PACAF, Bentwaters, and even Hahn. The history of Ammo was once again lit! The flames went into the wee hours of Sunday morning as people laughed and cheered.

Sunday morning came with pancakes and sausage from the house and plenty of hot coffee. The tents and canopies, RV, and camper started to pack up and engines began to warm up. Hugs were in order, and a few tears were shed that morning as people said good byes as their long treks home began. In the usual way, Ammo Ambassador Jimmy Taylor, stayed to the end to make sure everyone got off safely and the operation had been completed. Everyone thanked myself (Retired Ammo Bob Jones) and the wife for a job well done. As we watched each of our brothers and sisters leave the end of the driveway, we shed some tears as they left, however, we felt proud that we had the opportunity to "Keep the Flame Burning!" It was a solemn moment as the Ammo Flag was lowered Sunday night, but I could still hear IYAAVAS echoing through the limbs and leaves of the Live Oak trees! Ammo Call has returned to South Georgia!
