
For all those attending the Reunion, we'll see you in the Alamo city!


Chapter News

Mid-Atlantic Chapter (ACAMC)

Since our last input in June, the Ammo Chiefs Association Mid-Atlantic Chapter (ACAMC) has been keeping busy to lend support to the Ammo Community.

We finally received our payment for the April Richmond International Raceway (RIR) fundraiser. At our most recent meeting on September 17th, we developed a formula for compensating the Joint Base Langley-Eustis Ammo Morale Team (AMT) for their assistance. Once we get a firm point of contact for the AMT, we'll mail a check for \$825.00 to help the AMT support their local programs

Our President, Jackie Miller, put together and mailed four summer ACAMC care packages to austere bases in combat locations (Kandahar, Bagram, Jordan, and Ali Al Salem). Chief Nielson from Bagram acknowledged receipt of their package and had a flag flown over the installation for us. Rich and Sue Pennington are going to encase the flag and certificate for us so they can be permanently displayed at the 1 FW Munitions Flight.



The most recent RIR fundraising event was held on September 9th and 10th. We had nine members participate and Jackie Miller sweated it out for both days! We hope to receive the check within the next month or so.

We held our last general membership meeting on September 17th at Capt Billy's Crab House in Newburg, MD. Nine members attended along with guests, and a new Associate Member, Bob Yeager. With six proxy votes, we easily were able to conduct Chapter business. Unfortunately, Frank Waterman and George Heinlein are still in the recovery mode from back surgery and were unable to attend. We wish them the best in this long, recovery process. The Chapter treated the group to a fine meal and beverages. Our membership is now 22 Chief and 5 Associate members.



One goal of the meeting was to ensure we stay abreast of the award programs and support of Ammo troops at awards banquets. We will test our new processes this coming quarter.

At the meeting, we set the stage for additional fundraising for the Holiday Ammo Troops-in-Need program. Transcript of above Video: "We support the flight line with all their munitions close air support at Bagram Airfield Afghanistan and maintain anything that explodes pretty. On a daily basis we build munitions and maintain munitions that fly and don't get dropped so when they come back we make sure they're checked and good to go before they go into the air again."

"We provide the close air support with the small arms as well all our guys on the ground anytime they're in trouble they give us a call and anything that we build will guarantee go off."

"In this job you can't be afraid. Most people in their daily lives don't ever deal with explosives or deal with situations where their life could be in danger you know just by going to work. The person has to kind of have the fortification to realize you know something can go wrong."

"We signed up for this but we trust each other and we rely on each other and when you're out on a bomb pad building bombs with people then you have to trust the person next to you that's dealing with explosives that they're not going to drop something and possibly put your life and other people's lives in danger."

"We had one situation where we had a short tasking and we supply the munitions for ground troops in contact and one of our guys that we worked with ended up meeting one of the individuals that was in the situation on the ground who had been injured and he thanked us for the munitions that we built because it saved a lot of his guys lives and it saved his life."

"I love my job. I've had the opportunity to cross train a few times but I have actually ended up turning it down because the Brotherhood and the camaraderie that's within our career field. I couldn't choose better people to work with."
