Secretary's Section



At the General Membership Meeting held last November, the attendees agreed to change the Constitution with regard to the terms of office and election cycles of the Officers. Additionally, it was agreed to extend the term of office of all current Officers to 31 December 2011. A PDF copy of the revised Constitution is attached. The revision changes the term of office from two years to four years and provides for all officers to serve concurrent terms.

Since the term of office for all officers expires this year it will be necessary to hold elections in the coming months. The President will shortly be calling for nominations for President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Chief at Arms, and four Directors at Large, all to serve for four years from 1 January 2012. Please consider serving your Association as an Officer. The Treasurer (Danny Bridges) and I as Secretary will be stepping down at the end of this term. The ACA needs your support.

Membership: Our current Membership is 147 members in good standing with 66 in-active or lapsed members. Annual Dues for the current year should have been paid by 1 February. We know everyone gets busy at this time of year, but please take a few minutes to send in your dues.

The attached membership roll is current as of 20 April 2011! If you have not paid since 2007 you have been dropped from the Membership Roll. Please check it and if you believe there is an error let me know. If you have paid dues continuously you are eligible to convert/upgrade from Annual Membership to Life Membership by paying the additional years to receive credit for 10 years payments. Please contact me for the balance of your prorated payments.

If you previously joined or submitted an application to the ACA and you are not listed, your membership has lapsed! We would welcome you back, you may be reinstated by paying 2011 dues, \$25; send checks to ACA Secretary, 6046 SW 98 Loop, Ocala, Florida, 34476.

Please check the roster and use it to recruit those active duty or retired Ammo Chief's who have lapsed or are not yet members. Send applications to ACA Secretary, 6046 SW 98 Loop, Ocala, Florida, 34476 with a check for \$25 (or life membership \$250)! Applications for Associate Membership must be endorsed by a current member.

There were enough funds left over from what was allocated to purchase first two plaques to pay for two additional plaques.

This will be one of the first actions the newly elected ACA officers will have to undertake. It would be good if we could get a jump on some ideas of where we would like for it to be held? We need our membership to start the communication process to start identifying some candidate locations. Once a location is nailed down a reunion committee will have to be formalized to start the planning. Some of the key areas/options for consideration, location, time of year. We look forward to hearing back from you with ideas—at this point everything is open for discussion.

Future Leaders

Those of us who live in one of the southern states we are familiar about Junior ROTC and the benefits of grooming young people to be successful productive citizens of this great country. As a young man growing up in the mid-west, JROTC did not exist. Even today my home state only has one Air Force Junior ROTC unit. When asking why, excuses range from lack of funds to resentment by many about teaching our youth military core values. The Air Force Junior ROTC Mission is to develop citizens of character dedicated to serving their nation and community with the Goal of instilling values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility, and sense of accomplishment. Never have I walked into a JROTC class with the intention of convincing students to go into the military. My goal is to help them be successful, and help them get through high school. Whatever choice a student makes in becoming a productive successful citizen—my goal is to help them get there. The curriculum tools the Air Force provides, such as lessons in leadership, aerospace science, physical fitness, life skills, community service and drill and ceremonies help prepare these students to be America's future leaders.

At Z. B. Vance High School in Charlotte, North Carolina we take great pride in community service activities. Community services such as going to the middle schools and teaching various lessons in money management, group dynamics, and behavioral skills. Every AFJROTC cadet at Vance HS in the grades 10 through 12 participates in this program. Another service is during the local, state and national elections when we station cadets at polling stations to inspire America's youth to vote. This program is called "Kids Voting" and serves to instill knowledge and awareness in our electoral system. Drug Abuse Prevention education teams continually fan out to the middle schools to present talks and skits in an effort to deter drug use and abuse. Kids teaching kids----building future leaders.

Drill and Ceremonies is a vital part of the curriculum of every Air Force Junior ROTC program. Cadets learn teamwork, discipline, and learn to understand and accept the individual behaviors associated with working in a group. Every cadet must learn to be a follower and a leader. Military drill is an excellent device to make that happen. Every cadet at Z. B. Vance is required to learn military drill movements. What's unique at Vance is that each year, every cadet is also required to command a flight through a series of drill movements (marching). The first time they command a flight is very much like giving a speech for the first time----their scared and unsure of themselves-- but they do it. An amazing transformation occurs; they are becoming confident, motivated leaders.

The United States Air Force and our sister services invests heavily in the 21st Century JROTC programs. There are over 490,000 students enrolled in over 3,400 schools nationwide and overseas. The Air Force alone has about 869 programs in the high schools utilizing about 2000 retired officers and NCO's as instructors. Attendance and graduation rates of JROTC cadets consistently average in the mid to high 90 percent. . Too my fellow Ammo Troops be confident that America will be in good hands. These young Americas are bright, energetic, and want to lead our country into the future.
