
#### <u>From The Secretary:</u>





The AMMO Community and AFCOMAC host an annual educational Scholarship for dependents of AMMO Troops in his honor.









# Airman Heritage Foundation, Airmen Heritage Museum and the Ammo Chiefs Association

At the 2016 ACA Reunion held in San Antonio several members took a side tour and visited the Airman Heritage Museum on Lackland AFB. Many were impressed with the museum and what they hoped to achieve as they progressed. During our 2017 budget call one of our ACA members asked that the ACA purchase a Lifetime Membership and a Legacy Paver to show ACA support for the Museum and Foundation.

As we looked into this we determined that a better idea might be to purchase Legacy Pavers for our deceased members thus starting a new tradition. These purchases would also support the Museum with an ongoing basis but with the added benefit to the ACA of perpetuating the memory of our departed Ammo Chiefs, Associate Members and those conferred our Shell & Flame Award.

#### This new tradition would:

- Allow the ACA to purchase Legacy Pavers for deceased members in good standing with the ACA.
- Preserves our ACA past, meeting Art II of our Constitution "(d) perpetuating the memory of deceased AMMO Chiefs."
- Honors our members in a place where future Airmen and visitors will be able to view our own Ammo Heritage. Capturing the essence and the spirit of the career field.
- Send the Certificate to spouse or living relative.
- Be announced in the Shell & Flame Newsletter.
- Be easily tracked in our database to ensure no duplicates.
- Encourage others to purchase pavers for any deceased AMMO Chief who died prior to advent of the ACA and have them grouped with ACA

An ACA budget proposal was submitted to purchase pavers for those past ACA members who are now deceased, that proposal passed. Each year we will consider a line item in the budget to cover anticipated Legacy Pavers.

We negotiated with the Airmen Heritage Foundation and asked that any pavers purchased be grouped together, that our designated area be located on the grounds near a Bomber or Fighter Aircraft and that we receive a group discount for each paver purchased.

They agreed to the discount and adjusted their online purchase program so that we might be able to obtain the discount. This discount code also links each purchase to the ACA ensuring each paver is placed with our group.

The Foundations intent is to rebuild the current pathway around the parade grounds with a new walkway made with pavers. Placement of the pavers will be determined at a later date as they go through construction and modification of the parade grounds to meet ADA compliance.

As indicated earlier we intend to have the ACA members pavers grouped under an initial paver that will look like this. It has already been purchased and was included in the initial purchase of 15.

# CMSGT MICHAEL CURRAN AMMO CHIEF

A certificate of authenticity is provided with each legacy paver. Our intent would be to provide the certificate to the nearest living relative. If no family members are located the certificate would remain on record with the ACA Secretary. Here is what it would look like.



In November 2017 we purchased the first 15 Legacy Pavers, 5 of those were purchased by other members for Ammo Chiefs who never had the opportunity to belong to the ACA. These were purchased as a donation and all were for deceased ACA Ammo Chiefs. Since then we have purchased an additional 5 Legacy Pavers to cover the Shell & Flame deceased and other members who were in good standing at the time of their deaths.

The ACA Membership Database has been updated and is tracking all purchased pavers. The entire pathway once completed will be set with blank bricks and as ACA Legacy Pavers are purchased they would replace the blanks.

The Legacy Pavers carry a lifetime warranty. Once a paver is purchased and placed the foundation would replace any that might be damaged.

The ACA is the first organization to do group buys and therefore they are offering us some preference on pricing and paver placement within limits.

You too can purchase a legacy paver for a deceased Ammo Chief. Please consider past friends and mentors. Or purchase your own and have it included with the group. As a reminder, there are three (3) lines on each paver limited to 14 characters on each line, includes spaces.

We hope this relationship with the Airman Heritage Museum and Foundation is a long one and that it meets with your approval as a way to increase our own AMMO heritage. It is important to note that all ACA members' pavers who are current on dues at the time of their death will be funded by the ACA.

Some BOD members expressed a desire to purchase their own legacy paver, thus saving the ACA of the cost at some future date. In some cases members also expressed a desire to purchase pavers for past friends who were Ammo Chiefs and passed away prior to the start of the ACA. In either case this would be a tax deductible expense as it fits our organizations purposes.

Right now we can control the process by having the Treasurer place orders. If you want to order a Legacy Paver please contact the treasurer at: <a href="mailto:acatreasurer@ammochiefs.com">acatreasurer@ammochiefs.com</a>. He can also provide a list of deceased Ammo Chiefs who have not had the benefit of being able to join the ACA from which you can choose.

We will be notified once the pavers start going into the walkway around the parade grounds.

ACA Legacy Pavers are \$65 each, a savings of \$15 per paver.

Below is a representation of what the pavers might look like once placed. We have no way of knowing at this time what the width of the path will be and that will determine the final layout. Pavers will be placed in the order of purchase date and in no way reflects any other agenda.

#### **Ammo Chiefs Association Reunion Update**

#### Greetings,
