

Dear Chief Kennedy,

Thank you very generous care package you and others from the Mid-Atlantic Chiefs Association sent to us this last holiday season. For most of the Airmen, they would never say they needed anything if asked. However, it is awesome so have the support from AMMO leaders past and present, far and wide!

This deployment has been a challenge! We have combined forces with Air National Guard members from Selfridge and Boise with Active Duty from Davis-Monthan and Creech to form a 65-person Munitions Flight, responsible for bringing the fight to our nation's enemies wherever they may be found. We did so with a fleet of 12 A-10 Thunderbolt IIs and 29 MQ-9 Reapers totaling 4.9K sorties and 73K flight hours. Since our arrival, we've expended 118K rounds of 30mm, 342 GBU-38/54s, 654 2.75 inch rockets, 22 AGM-65Ls and 992 Hellfire missiles worth over \$109M and wiped this earth clean of 3.1K enemy fighters. These men and women of AMMO were the driving force behind the pressure campaign to bring the Taliban to the negotiating table in Doha (or destroying them if need be), all while simultaneously eradicating ISIS fighters from their strongholds in Kunduz and Kabul. Recently, we've endured increased aggression from Iran and stand ready to bring the fight if called upon.

These are just a few of the remarkable things AMMO has achieved and life is just a little bit easier with the support we receive from our families, friends and those who footsteps we follow in. Please accept this flag as a token of our sincere thanks for the support you have provided to this team. AMMO makes the mission and I thank you for being there for our Airmen!



The Chief Master Sergeant (CMSgt) Richard A. Gauvin Ammo Troop Memorial Fund was founded in June 1998 by Class 9806 as a continuing class legacy to pay tribute to Chief Gauvin for his selfless contributions to his country and the Ammo community. Class 9806 contributed the initial funds in the amount of \$400.00, obtained through personal contributions by class members. All class members agreed the fund should be established to award scholarships to children of munitions personnel who held AFSC 461XX, 465XX or 2WOX1 on active, reserve, or ANG duty in the service of the USAF.

The Air Force Combat Ammunition Center (AFCOMAC) Senior Staff will administer the scholarship fund. All future AFCOMAC classes will have the opportunity to raise funds and contribute to expanding the scholarship fund.

The USAF Major Command Functional Managers who act as the AFCOMAC Board of Advisors (BOA) will be the Scholarship Selection Committee to review, approve, and decide on the amount awarded to each applicant. All scholarship applicants will submit their applications prior to 1 June of each year.

The AMMO Chiefs Association (ACA) contributes \$500 annually directly to the AFCOMAC BOA selected recipient of the Chief Gauvin Memorial Scholarship.

# Air Force selects 530 in 19E9/chief master sergeant promotion cycle; list posts Nov. 25

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas -- Air Force officials have selected 530 senior master sergeants for promotion to chief master sergeant out of 2,529 eligible for a selection rate of 20.96 percent.

The chief master sergeant promotion list will be available on the Air Force's Personnel Center website **Enlisted Promotions** page, the Air Force Portal and myPers Nov. 25, at 8 a.m. CST. Airmen will also be able to access their score notices on the virtual Military Personnel Flight via the AFPC secure applications page.

Those selected for chief master sergeant will be promoted beginning Jan. 1, 2020, according to their promotion sequence number.

Commanders will receive notice of their selects from their senior rater's agent starting Nov. 18.

#### **AIRMEN these Days: Volume 2**

Editors Note: while not an AMMO story, it remains joyous to know that we have Airman like this serving in our Air Force.

I've heard the comment, "Airmen these days" quite a bit over the years. It's usually from a negative standpoint; how today's Airmen are not as disciplined, dedicated, or mature as those from "back in my day..." To help others see the greatness in our Airmen who join and stay on our team (no matter what age) – this series of posts called "Airmen these Days" will demonstrate it.

Let me introduce you to Airman Haakon Storm. In September he made the trip to San Antonio to attend Air Force Basic Military Training (BMT). Upon arrival, his Military Training Instructors (MTI) noticed he was somewhat withdrawn from his flight and showed little to no self-confidence. This is overall not uncommon as trainees face the stressors of transforming into Airmen and becoming a team with a group of people who only days prior were complete strangers. To help their flight get passed this challenging period, MSgt Philip Lowery and TSgt Daniel Sayarot ask their trainees to write a letter to explain and reflect why they came in the Air Force, or to share something the trainee would like the MTI to know about them as they begin training.

Here's Trainee Storm's answer to that question: "Why I joined the Air Force - I wasn't really doing anything with my life. I dropped out of college two weeks in because I was depressed. My best friend committed suicide on February 12th, 2018 and everything just kinda seemed pointless. I wanted a fresh start and being an Air Traffic Controller perks my interest. I consider myself a failure even though none of my family or friends did. I feel like I failed my best friend. Joining the Air Force gives me the chance to save people when I couldn't before."

This is the point where you should stop and pause for a minute to really take that in (it gave me chills when I did). What happened next is powerful. His MTIs recognized the fighting spirit within Trainee Storm and immediately began working to use it to shape and motivate him. With every challenge Trainee Storm was given – he excelled. He was named a Tactical Deployment Leader at the Basic Expeditionary Airman Skills Training (BEAST) exercise, helping fellow trainees work through how to communicate and operate in a combat setting as a team. He scored a 99/100 on his End of Course examination which tests all aspects of the foundational competencies of what it means to be an American Airman. He achieved a perfect score on his physical fitness test. Basically, anything we put in front of him – he absolutely crushed and did it all because of his desire to SERVE OTHERS.

The results of his demonstrated leadership, teamwork, and warrior-mindset culminated in his selection as the Top Graduate from more than 750 Airmen, who completed BMT on 1 November 2019. While this recognition is a very rare and a significant honor, the best part of this story is Airman Storm's heroic journey to fight through the punches life threw at him. It's the definition of what RESILIENCE is all about. Pure grit, determination, and hunger to turn tragedy into inspiration. He made the choice to not sit idle on the sidelines and went out on the hunt to be a better version of himself. And just like how Haakon realized he wanted to be able to help someone else, his Military Training Instructors were fueled by the same internal desire. They played a vital role in his success because they believed in Airman Storm even when he didn't believe in himself. Airmen of different tenures and positions in the team, with a common bond to serve and uplift those around them – there's massive beauty in that.
