During the Reunion Business Meeting – We will discuss new business regarding the Gauvin Scholarship program. ACA will be taking over management of the program in 2025, we have setup a financial account for management of funds for the program. Our next major task is to setup the program management for how we will manage the Scholarship Program, as such we need to determine if we should establish a new Board Member as the Gauvin Scholarship Manager, then elect someone to that position or we simply designate one of the Director At Large as the Gauvin Scholarship Manager. The following is an overview of the process that will be created and documented once we have identified who the Gauvin Scholarship Manager will be.

- 1. ACA Treasurer will ensure any collected funds are deposited into the account, notify the BOD of available funds, validate and disperse funds to the awardee(s) colleges.
- 2. ACA Secretary will be focal point for package submission, forward those packages to the Scholarship manager, and notify winners once the selection process is completed.
- 3. Gauvin Scholarship Manager Collects packages from Secretary, ensure candidates meet scholarship criteria, submits packages to the Directors at Large for scoring, once scored submits results to ACA President and ACA Vice President for validation. Maintains history of each year's awardees.
- 4. ACA President and Vice President Monitors Scholarship Schedule to ensure process is completed to support submission dates, validates awards, notifies Treasurer and Secretary to notify awardees and distribute funds.

Please submit a voting proxy or notify the ACA Secretary of your preference on the issue to be voted on. 1. Create a new Board Position or 2. Select one of the Director at Large positions as the Manager.




Hello ACA Membership! As already mentioned, the transition of the Gauvin Memorial Scholarship program to the ACA has been set for 2025. Be advised revenue to support this program so far in 2024 is a small fraction of what was been collected in past years. That is primarily due to loss of revenue from the single greatest source, AFCOMAC classes, which was 60-75 percent of all previous revenues. So far in 2024, the program receives a single monthly donation and occasional donations from AFCOMAC classes or conference collections which are all appreciated. At the current pace of revenue, we will need to drastically reduce the scholarship awards from the 7-10 awarded annually, to just 1 or 2. As most of you know, this program primarily supports dependents of active duty AMMO troops, so getting the word out to the active duty community might help to get some more monthly donations going. We're going to need more help from HAF, MAJCOM, and Base Chiefs to get that word out to the troops. New: You can now also pay for Legacy Pavers using Venmo to **@IYAAYAS-ACA**. In the comments be sure to include what you want on the paver. Paver text is limited to 3 lines and 14 characters per line (including spaces).

The price of one paver \$95. However, ACA receives a \$15 discount from Airman's Heritage Foundation (AHF), so our cost is \$80 per paver. Also, if you 2 or 3 pavers at the same time, there is an additional \$5.00 / paver quantity discount applied. Be advised that any orders placed via PayPal and paid with credit/debit card will include a PayPal processing fee which is included in the below pricing. The full Legacy Paver pricing chart follows:

All pavers are placed as ordered and there can be no reserved spaces or special grouping. Orders would remain "First in - First out". Order your own, one for a mentor you respected while on duty, a friend, or a spouse. If you place an order and we find it is a duplicate, we will let you know. We would reserve the right to ensure any wording is in accordance with the AHF guidelines and our requirement that the paver have some wording related to AMMO so AHF knows to place the paver within our Group. Remember there are 3 lines of text limited to 14 characters per (including spaces).


